Action Projects Overview

Experience America showcases a range of distinctive cultural themes in the U.S. Throughout the Experience America course, students will study in a classroom setting, as well as "in the field" during action projects. In class, students will build English skills (speaking, listening, reading, writing, and grammar) to explore content related to action projects. On the action project days, students will visit an exciting variety of local sites to conduct information-gathering activities, work in small, diverse groups, and apply the communication skills they learn in class.

Action Project 1: Navigating Downtown Portland

Students will consider Portland's uniqueness and diversity while interacting with local communities, exploring cultural themes, discussing social-urban issues, and visiting prominent Portland destinations.

Action Project 2: Nature and Leisure

Students will explore the intersection of nature, recreation, and industry in the beautiful Columbia River Gorge with visits to Multnomah Falls and Vista House and a guided tour of Bonneville Dam.

Action Project 3: Urban and Suburban Lifestyles

This action project presents locations related to how Americans live, with an emphasis on local Portland culture. Students will engage in critical thinking about gender, income inequality, and diversity while visiting two vastly different American neighborhoods.

Action Project 4: Americana

Students will visit the Oregon State Fair in Salem, the state capital. The fair offers a wide range of opportunities for understanding and interacting with Oregonians, including farmers, craftspeople, entertainers, ranchers, and entrepreneurs.

The Short-term English Volunteer Course provides students with opportunities to use English in authentic settings, explore sociocultural issues, and serve local communities in need.
